

**Northern California Peace Corps Association Annual Report
January 1 – December 31, 2014**

Mission

The Northern California Peace Corps (NorCal) is a registered 501(c)(3) nonprofit. NorCal was incorporated in 1982 as an education based nonprofit. According to our Articles of Incorporation the Purpose of the Organization is public education about countries where volunteers serve and assisting returning volunteers with readjustment to life and work back in the United States. The Grants program, which provides small grants of \$500-\$2,000 to development projects, is operated as a distinct program from the purposes called out in our Articles of Incorporation. The Grants program does its own fundraising, most visibly through the sale of the international calendars every year as well as through donations from individuals who have earmarked funds for the Grants Program. Income and Expenses for the Grants program are tracked on our budgets and other financial documents as “Restricted Funds”.

Governance

NorCal is governed by an 11 person board of directors. There are 4 At Large Board Members and 7 board members elected to represent specific regions that NorCal serves: San Francisco: 2, East Bay: 2, South Bay: 1, North Bay: 1, Santa Cruz/Monterey: 1. At the December 2014 board meeting the board elected to add one director to the South Bay and one director to the East Bay to reflect growing membership within those regions.

Board Members serve for two years and elections are held once a year at the Annual General Meeting the last Saturday in January. Approximately half of the board positions open up each year.

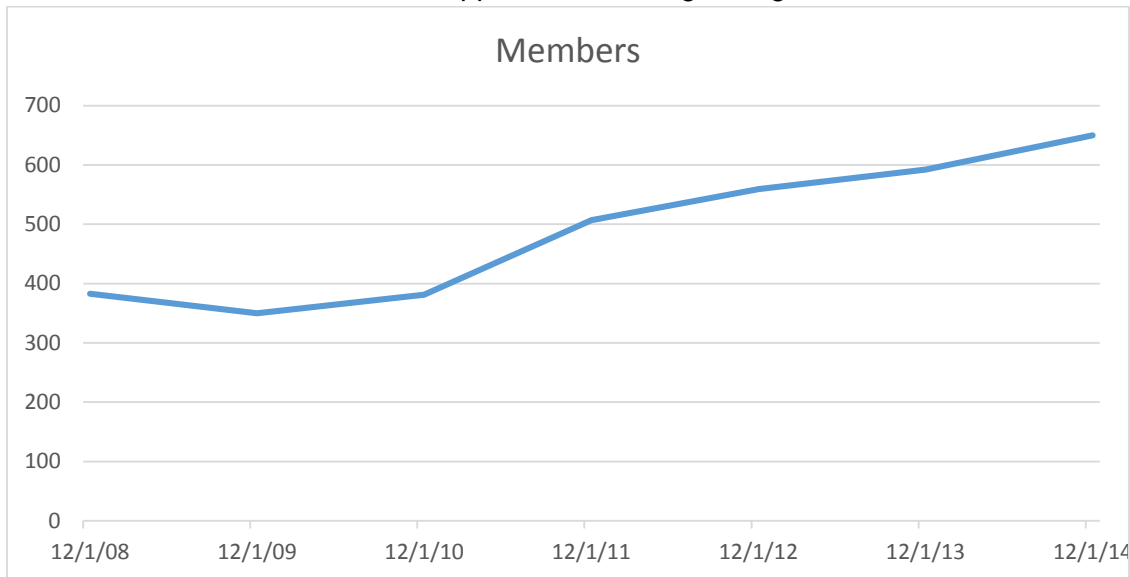

Membership

NorCal's membership has surged in recent years hitting a high point of 672 members in September of 2014 which is a welcome reversal of membership trends throughout the late 1990s to 2010, when membership bottomed out at 264 members.

Membership to the NorCal Peace Corps Association is open to all who support NorCal's Mission of International Education and assisting returned Volunteers with readjustment to work and life back in the United States. Membership dues are set at \$20 a year and are fully tax deductible. That rate has not changed in approximately 10 years, but one interesting trend is that we are seeing more members donating beyond the basic \$20 membership dues. In December two members donated \$500 each to support NorCal Programming.

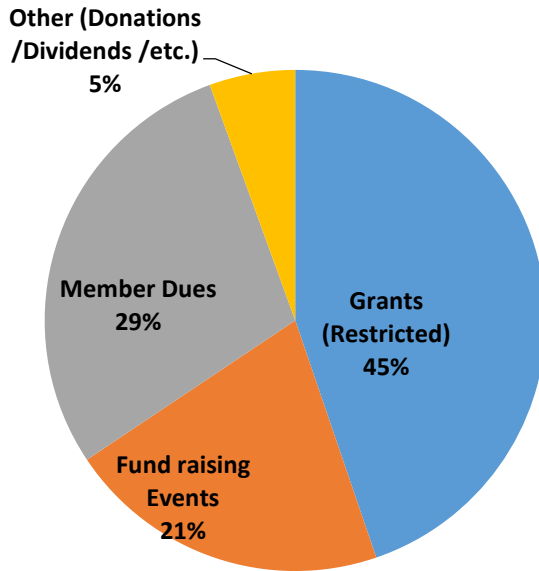

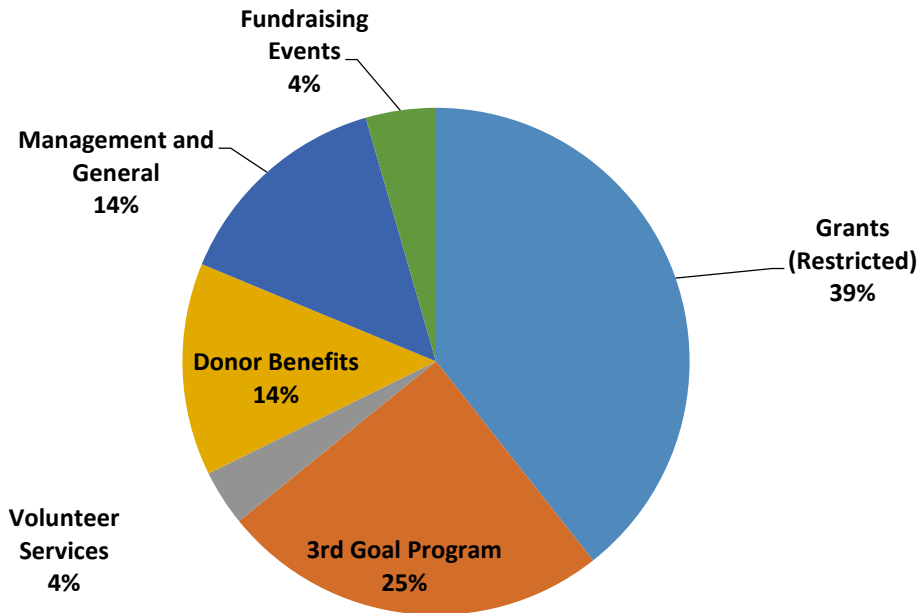
Fundraising

Currently NorCal does not have any regular fundraising activities beyond modest efforts from Calendar sales for Grants and a raffle at our Annual Luau BBQ. We do charge for some events but typically those funds are just enough to cover the cost of the event. It is likely a fundraising campaign focused on our membership typical of other nonprofits could raise significant revenues. Also our programs have matured enough to begin requested corporate support and begin applying for grants to foundations focused on supporting international education.

Global Presenters

The Global Presenters Program is the core of NorCal's International Education Mission. It runs workshops on giving presentations, trains speakers, and does public outreach to raise awareness of the program among schools and community groups, processes requests for volunteer presenters, and follows up after presentations.

In 2014 the Global Presenters Program facilitated 56 matches of RPCVs to schools and community groups ranging from Girl Scout Troops to the Commonwealth Club.



In November 2014 after a three month search process NorCal hired its first ever staff person, Betsy Aaron to be the Global Presenter Outreach Coordinator.

Storytelling Series



NorCal's Storytelling Series, Beyond Borders Storytelling (formerly The Bridge), runs workshops, practice storytelling sessions and story jams in San Francisco and South Bay with goals of expanding services to the North Bay and Fresno in 2015. In 2014 Beyond Borders storytelling hosted 24 workshops, story practice sessions and 8 story jams in San Francisco, Oakland, Palo Alto and Mountain View.

Through workshops and practice storytelling events Beyond Borders storytelling trained approximately 55 storytellers who went on to perform in Story Jams.

Santa Cruz/Monterey has own storytelling program managed by students at the Monterey Institute of International Studies, Peace Corps Club. They hosted 2 story jams in 2014.

Festival of Cultures

Every year on the last Saturday in January NorCal hosts a Festival of Cultures where Peace Corps Volunteers from around Northern California gather to celebrate, learn and share experiences from over 100 countries. This event is free and open to the public. The 2014 Festival included exciting presentations from recently returned volunteers from Vanuatu, Azerbaijan, Senegal and many other countries, sneak peeks at volunteer created films, a photography exhibit, panel discussions, storytelling workshops and a Town hall on current Peace Corps initiatives.



There were also workshops for recently returned volunteers focusing on how to successfully transition back to life in the states including resume reviews, translating your Peace Corps experience into effective interviewing and using noncompetitive eligibility to land a Federal job.

Joint Events with the Commonwealth Club of California

NorCal often partners to run programs featuring returned volunteers at the Commonwealth of California. This relationship also allows NorCal members discounted tickets to select Commonwealth Club events. In 2014 NorCal partnered with the Commonwealth Club for 5 events including a panel discussion on the Ukraine and a Story Jam.



Newsletter

NorCal publishes a free monthly eNewsletter on the first Wednesday of each month. The newsletter features original articles of returned Peace Corps Volunteers from Northern California. Stories are selected based on a predetermine themes. The newsletter also regularly publishes reports on NorCal programs and an event calendar

Send Off Event

Each Year around late April NorCal collaborates with the local Peace Corps office to hold a Send Off Event for volunteers about to begin service. This rotates between San Francisco and Berkeley each year and normally draws a crowd of between 200-300 people. In 2014 the Send Off Event was held at the Women's Building in San Francisco.

Returned Volunteer Services

The second part of NorCal's Mission is to assist returning volunteers ease the transition back to life in the United States. In the past four years NorCal has added a host of new programs to provide substantial help to returning volunteers

Annual Career Fair



For the past 2 years NorCal has hosted a career fair at the Federal Building at Seventh and Mission in downtown San Francisco around July. There are hundreds of Returned Volunteers working in the Federal Government in the Bay Area who are willing to help returning volunteers find jobs in government service, particularly those who still have NonCompetitive Eligibility Status (NCE). Government agencies are very receptive to RPCVs and NorCal does outreach to private

and nonprofit employers to attend the career fair. The Career Fair also offers supporting services such as resume reviews, mock interviews and LinkedIn sessions. In 2014 nearly 40 employers and over 80 returned volunteers attended the Career Fair.

Job Skills Workshop

In 2014 Joe Lurie, past Executive Director of the International House at UC Berkeley and career coach, ran two job search skills for recently returned volunteers in March and July, right before the Career Fair. These workshops focused on tailoring resumes and preparing for job interviews. Twenty people attended the March workshop which was on a Saturday while 12 people attended the July workshop which was on Tuesday night. The workshops were co-organized by Katherine MacDougall and Will Spargur

Transition Workshop



In 2014 NorCal hosted two workshops focused on peer discussions of the issues recently returning volunteers experience as they make the transition back to life and work in the United States. The first workshop was held as part of the Festival of Cultures in Berkeley and another workshop was held the weekend before Thanksgiving in conjunction with a special dinner hosted by NorCal Treasurer Paul Reinhart and his wife Susan Sumner. At each event 30 recently returned volunteers attended. Both workshops were organized by Tess Marstaller (Cameroon 2010-2012). The Thanksgiving workshop was co-hosted by Alanna Crotty (Dominican Republic 2010-2013).

Returned Volunteer Mentoring

NorCal's Mentoring for Recently Returned Volunteers, connects the recently returned with RPCV mentors who can help with readjustment, give career advice or just provide a sympathetic ear. This program continues to thrive with over 53 active participants and 16 successful new matches in 2015.

Pre-Peace Corps Mentoring

In April of 2014, NorCal launched an additional arm of mentoring, "Pre-Peace Corps". This mentoring program is designed to support potential volunteers who are considering applying or are in the application process. RPCV mentors are available to give prospective volunteers support with honest advice, listening to concerns, helping through the decision process, or preparing to leave for service. We successfully matched 100% of the requests we received (6 prospective volunteers) and currently have 22 mentors in our database.

Brown Bag Career Sessions

David Song (Lesotho 2005-2007) initiated a new career assistance program in 2014 whereby employers would host lunch time career information sessions for returned Peace Corps Volunteers. In 2014 he hosted approximately five sessions: Square, EPA, Social Security Administration, SF Department of Public and First Solar.

Recently Returned BBQ

For the past 20 years Chris Carlise (Poland 1991-1993) has hosted a Welcome Back Party for recently returned Volunteers at his home in Berkeley. It usually draws a crowd of between 30-50. NorCal provides grilled hamburgers, hot dogs. Costs of this event are offset by asking Volunteers who have been back more than 18 months to donate \$10.



Jobs Board

The jobs board is a place for employers looking to hire RPCVs to post jobs. All RPCVs new to the area are encouraged to join the Yahoo Jobs List Serve. Employers and other RPCVs post job openings on daily basis. (http://NorCal.org/newcontent.cfm?id_con=126)

Grants Program

Since 1981, NorCal has provided support for domestic and international projects with funds that have been specially earmarked for grants projects. NorCal's Grants Program supports community development projects around the world. While there is no minimum-maximum size, most grants average from \$500-\$2000 depending on the amount requested and funds available.

In 2014 the Grants Committee recommended funding for four projects that were approved by the NorCal Board for a total amount of \$6,300.

1. \$850 to the Promoting Productive Livelihoods Project (PPLP) in El Salvador. PPLP is a youth program supported by two high schools, Instituto National de Perquin and Education Complex of San Fernando, both located in the Northern Morazan, a poor rural mountain region. This project includes a business basics and incubator course that will run for 20 weeks, attended by 50 high school students. Participants will be responsible for creating team marketing plans for a good or service and presenting them to a panel of judges from the community. NorCal Grants funds will be used for class supplies and student materials. The project was proposed by PCV Hilary Jacobsen of Marin County who is concurrently a Master's International student at Monterey Institute of International Studies.

2. \$2,000 to Mali Kalanso, a non-profit organization that supports education in Nienebale, Koulikoro Region, Mali. Mali Kalanso was co-founded by Mali RPCVs in 2010. The program has built a preschool, three primary school classrooms, and most recently, started a middle school with their community partners. This year, the village leaders declared that girls would complete their education before being promised for marriage, "an immense cultural shift in a remote traditional community" according to Mali Kalanso. The first class of 7th graders started in the Fall of 2014. NorCal Grants funds will provide student desks and other needed furniture for this classroom. NorCal member Katie Christ (RPCV Mali), a co-founder of Mali Kalanso, proposed this project.

3. \$1,800 will go to the Philippine Federation for Environmental Concern (PFEC) for their honey and beeswax gathering and processing project in the Philippines. PFEC supports the Dumagat Remontado indigenous people who live in the Tayabasan Sub-watershed area in Metro Manila. The honey and beeswax project aims to expand economic capacity in a sensitive way. 20 people will participate in an initial training program. NorCal Grants funds will be used for equipment and presentation materials to expand the program. The project was proposed by NorCal member Larry Maurin (RPCV Zambia) who served 8 months as a Peace Corps Response Volunteer with PFEC in 2013-2014.

4. \$1650 will go to the Reading Sierra Leone Book Distribution Project of Schools for Salone. Started by RPCVs, Schools for Salone (SfS) is a non-profit organization committed to helping Sierra Leoneans support education in their country. As part of their ongoing efforts, they have identified 31 different books that are locally written and illustrated by Sierra Leoneans and Liberians. The audience is first to sixth graders. SfS plans to distribute the books to schools

where there are established relationships. Transportation and library responsibilities in Sierra Leone will be covered by local representatives. NorCal Grants funds will pay for 825 books (\$2/each). The project was recommended by NorCal member, Bob Heavner, RPCV Sierra Leone.
